HOME EDUCATION PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The South Williamsport Area School District Policy 137, Home Education Programs, can be found on the district website <u>www.swasd.org/</u> under General Information, District Policies. Home Education Programs must be conducted in compliance with Pennsylvania Law, and Policy 137, 137.1, 137.2, and 137.3.

Important Dat Ongoing:	tes: All new applications and affidavits to conduct home schooling are requested at least (2) two weeks in advance of beginning home schooling. (Appendix A)
February 15 th :	Letter of interest to participate in Career and Technical Education programing for grades 10 – 12 is due. (Appendix B)
June 30th:	Evaluator's certification must be submitted to the school district certifying appropriate education.
August 1st:	Annually and prior to commencement of the Home Education Program, a new affidavit (Appendix A) is required to be submitted to the South Williamsport Area School District along with academic goals.
August 1st:	All requests for participation in PIAA Interscholastic Athletics are due. (Appendix C)
August 15th:	All requests for SWASD materials are due. (Appendix D)
August 15th:	All requests for participation in academic classes are due. (Appendix E)

Regulations:

Under School Board Policy 137.2, students attending home education programs shall be given an equal opportunity to compete for positions and participate in district cocurricular activities and academic courses in accordance with Board policy on the same basis as other students enrolled full-time in the district. No special transportation accommodations will be provided to home educated students. Home educated students who wish to participate in any SWASD activity will be required to complete a full enrollment registration packet and provide all required documentation. The school principal and staff will be responsible for supervision and discipline of home educated students while participating in school activities. Students will be expected to follow all rules and regulations of the South Williamsport Area School District.

Under School Board Policy 137.3, Students attending home education programs shall be given an equal opportunity to apply for placement in available programs at Williamsport Area School District Career and Technical Center. No special transportation accommodations will be provided to home educated students. Home educated students who wish to participate in any SWASD activity will be required to complete a full enrollment registration packet and provide all required documentation. Home education students must comply with applicable policies and school rules and administrative regulations of Williamsport Area School District Career and Technical Center regarding student conduct in school and at school-sponsored activities. The school principal and staff will be responsible for supervision and discipline of home educated students while participating in school activities. Students will be expected to follow all rules and regulations of the Williamsport Area School District.

Application/Affidavit:

Appendix A is the application and affidavit required by the South Williamsport Area School District for home schooling. The form must be submitted to Mrs. Chloe Smith, at the South Williamsport District Office (address and contact listed above). Once the application has been reviewed and approved by the Superintendent, a letter will be sent confirming approval by the school district. An affidavit is required for each individual child being enrolled in home schooling.

Homeschool Students Participating in SWASD Academics

Home school students enrolling in any SWASD academic classes must complete the district student registration process and provide all necessary documentation. The district registration portal is available via link by emailing Mrs. Chloe Smith at <u>csmith@swasd.org</u>. Students will not be able to start academic classes or co-curricular activities until all documentation and forms have been completed.

Appendix E is used for all requests to participate in curricular academic classes. The request form is used to ensure students are placed in the correct academic class. Requests that are made after the August 15th deadline will still be accepted but will be based on availability in the requested class.

*No special transportation accommodations will be provided for students taking academic classes.

Homeschool Students Participating in Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programs

Home school students wishing to participate in CTE for the upcoming school year must submit a letter of interest (Appendix B) to Miss Mallee Hornberger (contact info above) no later than February 15. All interested students tour the facility in early spring and are able to request CTE enrollment following that tour. The district has a contract with WASD for CTE programming and there are only 60 seats available in

the program per year. Interest in these programs is very high, and often times there are more applicants than seats available. It is important to submit your letter of interest and complete the CTE tour with the district.

If awarded a seat in a CTE program, home education students must complete the district student registration process and provide all necessary documentation. The district registration portal is available via link by emailing Mrs. Chloe Smith at <u>csmith@swasd.org</u>. Students will not be able to start their CTE program until all documentation and forms have been completed.

Materials:

August 15th - Requests to use school materials must be submitted by this date for use in the upcoming school year. Appendix D is used for all requests for materials, one request per student. The request form asks questions to help school staff better understand your interest in materials.

Homeschool Students Participating in SWASD PIAA Interscholastic Athletics

Home school students wishing to participate in PIAA Interscholastic Athletics must complete the district student registration process and provide all necessary documentation. The district registration portal is available via link by emailing Mrs. Chloe Smith at <u>csmith@swasd.org</u>. Students will not be able to start athletics until all documentation and required forms have been completed.

An athletic physical and PIAA paperwork must also be completed for participation. This information is available on swasports.org/

*For all PIAA athletics, all procedures and guidelines enforced by the PIAA and SWASD must be met in order to be eligible to participate.

Appendix C is used for all PIAA Interscholastic athletics requests and is due by August 1st. Requests made after the August 1st deadline will still be accepted, but cannot guarantee participation if sport season has already started.

*No special transportation accommodations will be provided for students participating in athletics.

- 3. I attest that the subjects listed in paragraphs below will be offered in the English language for a minimum of 180 days of instruction, or for a minimum of 900 hours at the elementary level and 990 hours at the secondary level. Secondary age is considered seventh through twelfth grade
 - a. At the Elementary school level the following courses shall be taught: English, to include spelling, reading, and writing; arithmetic; science; geography, history of the United States and Pennsylvania; civics; safety education, including regular and continuous instruction in the dangers and prevention of fires; health and physiology; physical education; music; and art.
 - b. At the Secondary level the following courses shall be taught: English, to include language, literature, speech and composition; science; geography; social studies, to include civics, world history, history of the United States and Pennsylvania; mathematics, to include general mathematics, algebra, and geometry; art; music, physical education; health; and safety education, including regular and continuous instruction in the dangers and prevention of fires. Other courses may be included at the discretion of the supervisor. The following minimum courses in grades nine through twelve are established as a requirement for graduation in a home

education program: 1) Four years of English; 2) Three years of mathematics; 3) Three years of science; 4) Three years of social studies, 5) Two years of arts and humanities.

Article XIV requires that every child of school age be given by methods established by the state's Advisory Health Board, an annual vision test and measurement of height and weight, tests for tuberculosis under medical supervision at when beginning school and 9th grade, and other tests required by the Advisory Health Board. Children when beginning school and in the 6th and 11th grades must have a medical examination and comprehensive appraisal of health by a physician and a hearing test is required when the child begins school and at 2nd, 3rd, 7th and 11th grade levels. Children when beginning school and in the 3rd and 7th grades must have a dental examination by a dentist. A comprehensive health record shall be maintained for each child.
